V 172 SAFE AND EFFECTIVE GRINDING

Mt Waverley, Vic.: Skills Education, 1991

(vhs: 18 min.)

A practical guide to using off-hand grinding machines, highlighting safety factors.

V 173 SAFETY AND USE OF AIR COMPRESSORS

Mt Waverley, Vic.: Skills Education, 1989

(vhs: 13 min.)

A practical guide to the safe use and maintenance of air compressors.

V 176 DRIVING: RISKS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Mt Waverley: Safety Care Australia, 1992
(vhs: 16 min.)

The motor vehicle is the single largest cause of death in the Australian workplace. This video looks at the costs of motor vehicle accidents. Highlights the need for a safe driving program in the workplace and the components of the program. The four key elements are a) driver eligibility b) building awareness and confidence c) maintaining the fleet d) keeping records. (vhs: 12 min.)

This video highlights many areas of farm life where there is the greatest risk of accident - and offers helpful, practical advice on the best ways to avoid the risk of injury.

- V 190 AN EASY GUIDE TO HANDLING HAZARDOUS CHEMICALS
Rowville, VIC: Workplace Video Productions, 1992
(vhs: 18 min.)

This video covers various aspects of hazardous chemicals by using the "hindsight" of a chemical exposure victim who developed cyanide poisoning at his workplace.

- V 191 SKID STEER LOADER SAFETY
Oakleigh, Victoria: Safety Image, 1992
(vhs: 12 min.)

A skid steer loader is a piece of modern equipment. It's designed by the manufacturer to be as safe as possible, so that when you operate it properly, using common sense principles and following the operating instructions, little harm is likely to come to you or your machine.

(vhs: 12 min.)

The skin is the most seriously affected organ on the body when it come to safety. We show the various skin problems that occur in the workplace both outdoors and in a manufacturing environment,

We show foot injuries that have happened in various work places such as construction, council, workshop and manufacturing. The video explains correct footwear for each workplace and the importance for making the right choice.

Shopping Centre Emergency Procedures should consist of the following:

- bomb threat procedure cards

- V 204 SAFE HANDLING OF GASES
Mt Waverley: Safety Care, Australia, 1992.
(vhs: 19 min.)

Examines types of gas cylinders and how to handle them safely.

- V 211 CHAINSAW MAINTENANCE AND SAFETY
Mt. Waverley: Safety Care Australia, 1993
(vhs: 16 min.)

Every chainsaw operator should be aware of the dangers which relate to the operation of a chainsaw. The combination of a regularly maintained chainsaw with the correct safety procedures should ensure trouble free operation of the saw. The program covers:

Topics discussed: manual handling, chemicals handling and storage, housekeeping and safety procedures.

(vhs: 12 min.)

This video shows how, by working together health and safety committees, health and safety reps, management and employees made changes in the way

Brisbane: Department of Employment, Vocational Education, Training and Industrial Relations, 1991.
(vhs: 11 min.)

This video guides you through health and safety concerns in the office and ways in which risks can be minimised by paying attention to the right attitude, the right equipment and the right procedure

- V 266 RISKY BUSINESS - SAFETY IN THE WORKSHOP
Brisbane: DEVETIR, Division of Workplace Health and
